PAST SIMPLE PASSIVE

We use the passive voice to change the focus of the sentence.

My father crashed my car. (active – focus on my father)

My car was crashed by my father. (passive – focus on my car)

We often use the passive:

- when we prefer not to mention who or what does the action (for example, it's not known, it's obvious or we don't want to say)
- so that we can start a sentence with the most important or most logical information
- in more formal or scientific writing.

PRESENT PERFECT PASSIVE

To form the passive voice of the present perfect tense, you follow this structure:

Subject + has/have been + past participle

In the passive voice, the focus shifts from who performed the action to the action itself or the recipient of the action.

Many students have read the book. (active – focus on *many students*)

The book has been read by many students. (passive – focus on *the book*.)

Simple Present:

I HAVE/GET my documents PRINTED every day.



(My documents are printed every day.)

 **Present Continuous:**

I'M HAVING/GETTING my documents PRINTED now.

(My documents are being printed now.)

 **Simple Past:**

I HAD/GOT my documents PRINTED yesterday.

(My documents were printed yesterday.)

 **Past Continuous:**

I WAS HAVING/GETTING my documents PRINTED this morning.

(My documents were being printed this morning.)

 **Simple Future:**

I WILL HAVE/GET my documents PRINTED tomorrow.

(My documents will be printed tomorrow.)

 **Present Perfect:**

I HAVE HAD/GOTTEN my documents PRINTED since January.

(My documents have been printed since January.)

 **Modals:**

I (SHOULD-CAN-MAY-MIGHT-MUST) HAVE/GET my documents PRINTED.

(My documents can/should be printed.)

Active vs. Causative Passive

Below, we compare an active sentence with one in a causative passive structure to observe the differences in meaning:

I will paint the old doors. (Yo pintaré las puertas viejas.) (Active)



I will HAVE the old doors PAINTED. (Haré que PINTEN las puertas viejas. / Me pintarán las puertas viejas.)
(Causative Passive)

In the first sentence, with an active structure, the subject (I – Yo) performs the action of painting (paint the doors). In the second sentence, with a causative passive structure, the subject (I – Yo) does not carry out the action, but someone else does it.
